

# SIX BILLS ARE CO-SPONSORED

# Congress of the United States House of Representatives

Besides introducing legislation of his own, Congressman Young has agreed to co-sponsor a number of bills introduced by other members of the House of Representatives.

"While I've been concentrating on Alaskan issues for the most part, some of my colleagues in the House have asked me to join them in sponsoring legislation that will benefit all Americans," Young said.

Some of the bills he has co-sponsored include:

H.R. 7094 to amend the Internal Revenue Service Code to permit an exemption of the first \$5,000 of retirement income received by a taxpayer under a public retirement system or any other program if the taxpayer is at least 65 years of age.

H.R. 7096 to amend the Internal Revenue Service Code to provide that the personal exemption allowed a taxpayer for a dependent shall be available without regard to the dependent's income in the case of a dependent who is over 65 years of age, the same as in the case of a dependent who is under 19 years of age.

H.R. 7117 to amend the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 to authorize the establishment of a class of commuter air carriers and to provide for the issuance of certificates of public convenience and necessity to members of that class who may apply.

H.R. 7318 to insure the continuation of airline youth fares for people 21 years of age and younger.

H.R. 7448 to provide for the continued operation of Public Health Service Hospitals.

H.R. 7964 to prohibit the discrimination against locally recruited personnel in the granting of overseas cost of living pay differentials and allowances and equalize the compensation of overseas teachers.

Dear Alaskan:

My first 60 days in Congress have been both busy and productive—busy because of the unprecedented legislative load of this Congress, and productive because I have already been able to make headway on the pipeline and other issues of vital importance to our state.

The publication of this, my first Washington Report, gives me an opportunity to tell you what I have been doing since I was sworn in as Alaska's only member of the House of Representatives. But more important, it gives me my first chance to ask you for your views on the issues facing Alaska and the nation—issues that will be considered and acted upon by this, the 93rd Congress.

Many of you have already written to me, to inform me of your views, to support legislation I've introduced, or to ask my help with special Alaskan problems. I've done my best to answer those letters and to explain my thoughts on the issues.

Now, I am asking you to help me do the best possible job of representing you. Please take a few minutes to answer the questions below to let me know what your feelings are on some of the important issues facing Alaska and the nation.

As you'll see, I've provided separate sections for replies for men, women and young Alaskans to better allow all the members of your household to express their views. I've also asked that you write in the name of your town. You do not need to sign your name to the questionnaire unless you want to do so.

As soon as the responses are tabulated, I will report the results to the Congress on the floor of the House of Representatives and to the President. The results will be reported to you in my next Washington Report.

Postal and franking regulations prohibit the replies from being automatically returned to me, so I must ask you to invest 8¢ in Alaska and place a stamp on the reverse side to mail your replies back to me.
